Seguin

Seguin, Texas, located just 35 miles east of San Antonio, is one of the oldest towns in Texas, founded in 1838. Known for its heritage, outdoor adventures, and unique attractions, Seguin is a great destination for history buffs, nature lovers, and families alike.

One of Seguin's top attractions is the Sebastopol House State Historic Site, an 1856 Greek Revival-style home made of limecrete—a rare building material at the time. The Heritage Museum and the Los Nogales Museum provide fascinating insights into the area's past.









Outdoor enthusiasts can enjoy Lake McQueeney and the Guadalupe River, offering opportunities for boating, fishing, and kayaking. ZDT's Amusement Park is a family-friendly destination with gokarts, water rides, and even a wooden roller coaster.

Seguin is also home to the world's largest pecan, a tribute to the city's reputation as a major pecan-growing region.

Seguin's Squirrel Trail is a fun, self-guided tour featuring over 20 hand-painted squirrel statues scattered throughout town. Grab a Squirrel Trail Map from the Seguin Visitors Center and explore away!

Gonzales

Gonzales, Texas, known as the "Birthplace of Texas Independence," is a mustvisit destination for history enthusiasts and those seeking to experience small-town Texas hospitality.

Located about an hour east of San Antonio, south of Austin, and two hours west of Houston, it's the perfect spot for a weekend getaway or a fresh start. Whether you're staying in a cozy bed and breakfast or a historic home, you'll get a taste of the town's rich heritage.

Gonzales was pivotal in the Texas Revolution, famous for the "Come and Take It" flag, symbolizing Texan defiance against Mexican rule. Visitors can explore its unique seven public squares and five museums, including the Gonzales Memorial Museum, which houses artifacts from





the Texas Revolution like the cannon from the first battle of independence in 1835.

The Gonzales County Jail Museum showcases the history of Texas law enforcement, including the Texas Rangers.

Independence Square, surrounded by shops and cafes, is the town's lively center.

Outdoor enthusiasts can enjoy the scenic Guadalupe River, ideal for fishing, kayaking, and picnicking. Palmetto State Park, located a short drive away, offers lush landscapes, hiking trails, and abundant wildlife.



Step into Texas healthcare history at the city-owned Pharmacy & Medical Museum of Texas, housed in the restored 1889 Heaton Brothers Building, which operated as a drugstore for 123 years.

Founded by Joe and Wanda Reuss, descendants of Texas pioneers, the museum tells the story of Reuss Pharmacy, the state's oldest drugstore, established in 1845. It features artifacts

from Heaton Brothers Drugstore, L.L. Buttery Drugstore, and other historic Cuero pharmacies, highlighting their vital role.

See a recreated turn-of-the-century doctor's office, dental office, and medical lab, offering a glimpse into early Texas medicine.


